A mentor mentee session was conducted on 27.12.25 in room no. 305 at 3:30 pm, with the objective of guiding students on effective strategies for preparing for competitive examinations. The session aimed to address common challenges, provide structured preparation techniques, and motivate students to stay consistent in their efforts. Students were told about the importance of thoroughly analyzing the exam syllabus, pattern and marking scheme and were advised to focus on high-weightage topics. A structured study plan was suggested including, daily, weekly and monthly targets, balanced time allocation for all subjects and regular revision schedules. Students were encouraged to follow a disciplined routine and avoid procrastination. It was discussed that it is more important to choose limited and reliable study material rather than referring to multiple sources. Standard books, previous year question papers and mock tests were recommended. Regular practice was stressed as a key factor for success. Consistent revision to retain concepts, including short notes, flashcards and quick revision techniques before exams were suggested. The session also addressed mental well being. Students were encouraged to maintain a healthy life style and to stay positive and motivated. An interactive question-answer segment allowed mentees to clarify their doubts regarding subject specific preparation, time management and handling exam pressure. Students gained clarity on effective

strategies for preparation of exams and smart approaches to crack competitive exams. The mentor-mentee session successfully achieved its objectives by equipping students with practical strategies and boosting their confidence.

A mentor-mentee session was conducted on the topic 'Climate Change and its impact on biodiversity' on 10.09.25 in room no. 305 at 3:30 pm. The session was aimed to create awareness about environmental changes and their impact on biodiversity and ecosystems, especially in India. The session began with the introduction to climate change and its causes, global warming due to increased green house gases, deforestation and pollution. Effects of the climate change such as rising temperatures, irregular rainfall and extreme weather conditions were also discussed. The mentees actively participated in discussions and shared their views on environmental changes they observed. Impact of climate change on biodiversity and ecosystems were discussed in detail. The observations like melting or receding of glaciers in Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand, changes in flowering patterns, increased land slides etc. were also discussed through group discussions and question-answer sessions. By the end of session, mentees were able to understand the link between climate change and biodiversity loss and identify practical steps to reduce their ecological footprint. Various suggestions were also given like planting more trees, reduce pollution and spread awareness among people about environmental conservation.



A detailed discussion was done regarding best preparation of entrance exams. Further students were made aware of UGC (NET) exam after completion of Master degree.



## 2.9 Coaching for National level competitive exams:

Currently, the college does not offer specific coaching programs for national-level competitive examinations. However, recognizing the growing importance of such examinations for students' career prospects, the introduction of a structured coaching program is under consideration for future academic sessions.

At the individual level, faculty members regularly guide students by providing study materials, previous years' question papers (PYQs), and conducting doubt-clearing sessions. Furthermore, from the next academic session onwards, the IQAC suggested that teaching staff to formalize this mentoring process through proper documentation and maintenance of records, such as registers, to ensure systematic and consistent student support.

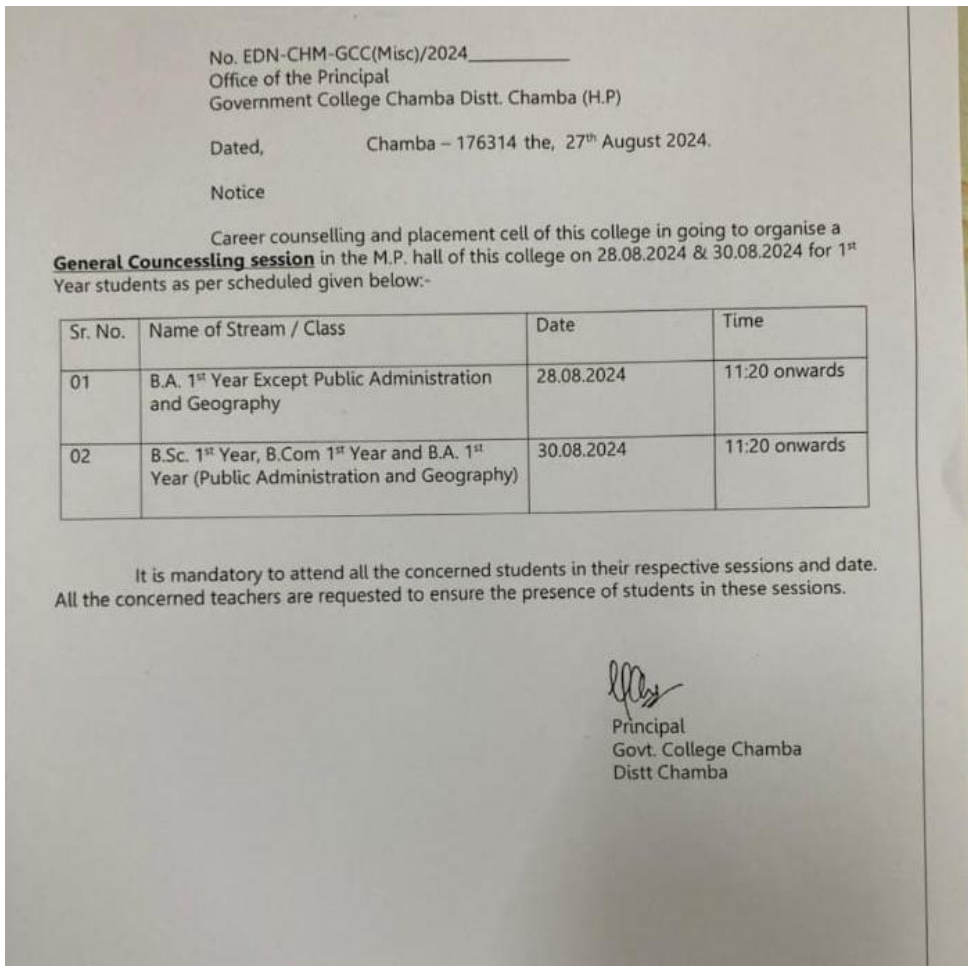

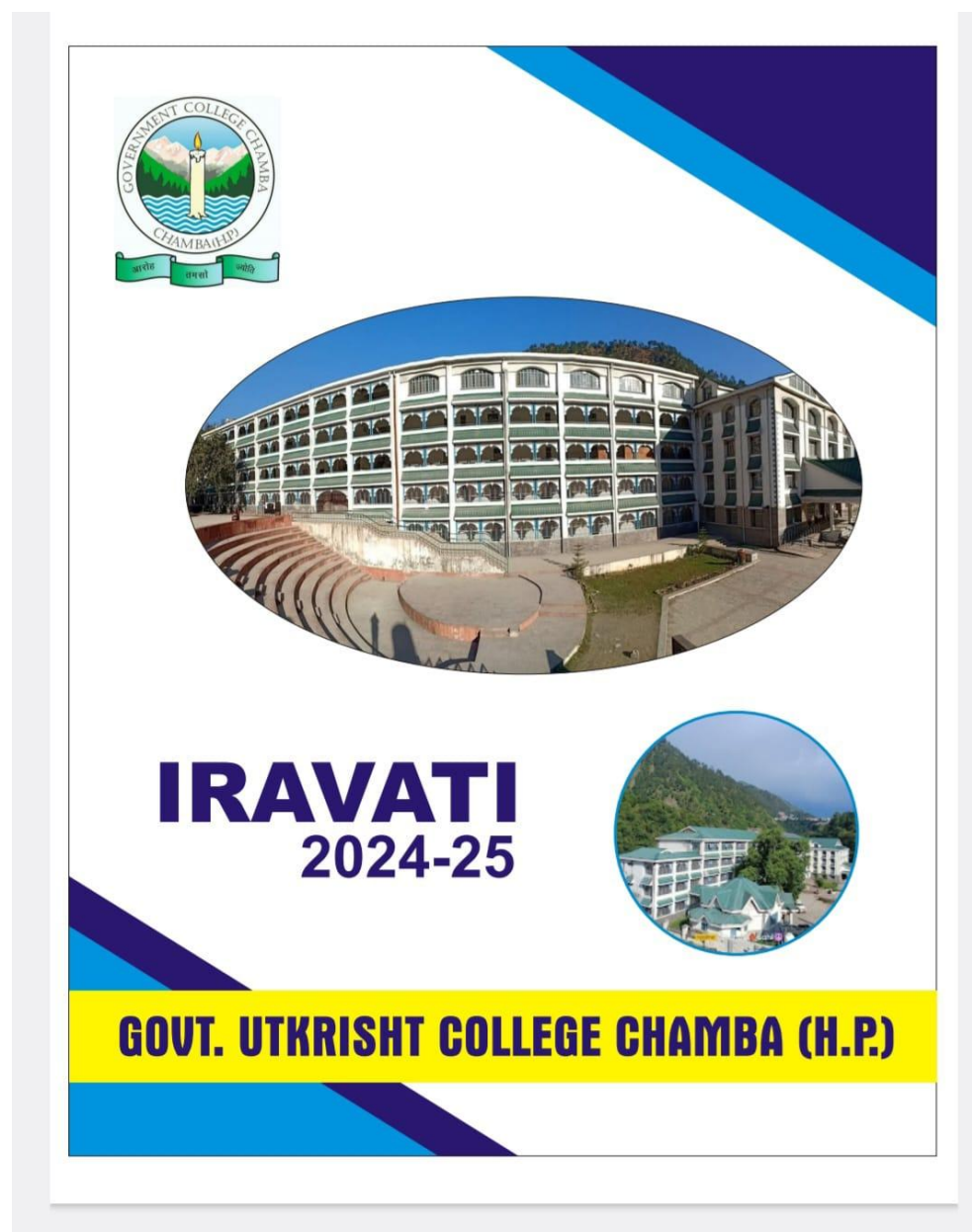
## 2.15 Annul Prize Distribution Function
