The College is Accredited with a **B++ grade by NAAC** in Aug-2022. The institution is fully funded by the state government and holds recognition from the **University Grants Commission (UGC)** under **Sections 2(f) and 12B** of the UGC Act, 1956. Affiliated with **Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla**, the college adopted the **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)** in 2013-14 under the **Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA)** guidelines.

College offers undergraduate and postgraduate programs across diverse fields like Arts, Science, Commerce, and Computer Sciences. The college is committed to providing a modern learning environment for its students. RENEWABLE ENERGY PVT. LTD. FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF JAI BANI MATA HEP (24 MW) IN DISTRICT CHAMBA WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF BHARMOUR FOREST DIVISION, DISTRICT CHAMBA, HIMACHAL PRADESH.

The characteristics of Eco-sensitive Zone of Tundah Wildlife Sanctuary were also elaborated in discussion. Thereafter, the Chairman informed the members that an initial proposal have been received from K.S. Renewable Energy Pvt. Ltd for the construction of Jai Bani Mata SHEP (24 MW) near Tundah village which lies in Eco-sensitive Zone of Tundah Wildlife Sanctuary within the jurisdiction of Bharmour Forest Division in district Chamba, Himachal Pradesh. In the minutes of meeting of Project Screening Committee, Government of Himachal Pradesh, the User Agency has been directed to submit the recommendations of the Monitoring Committee of Eco-sensitive Zone of Tundah Wildlife Sanctuary before the proposal is processed further.

During the meeting, the members discussed various technical aspects of the proposed SHEP and any likely impact on wildlife and ecology of the Tundah Wildlife Sanctuary and its Eco-sensitive Zone. The committee also deliberated upon stipulation specified in the notification number 394 dated 01/02/2022 of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, New Delhi notifying Eco-sensitive Zone of Tundah Wildlife Sanctuary. Perusal of the notification reveals that the proposed SHEP is not included in the prohibited category as per the said notification. However, the committee felt that the proposed project should put in place a **Comprehensive Wildlife Management Plan** that must include:

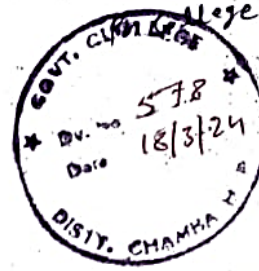

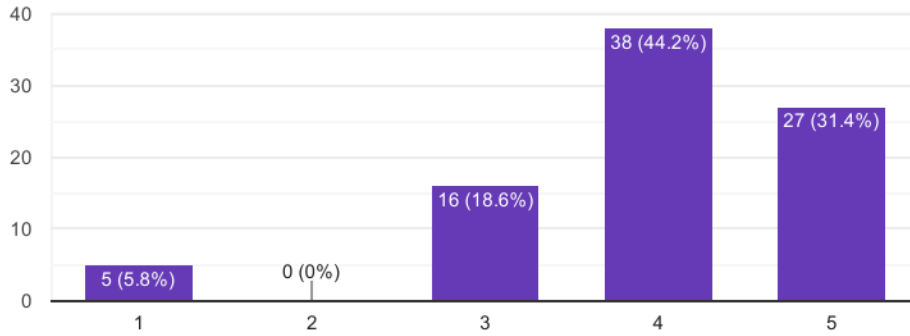

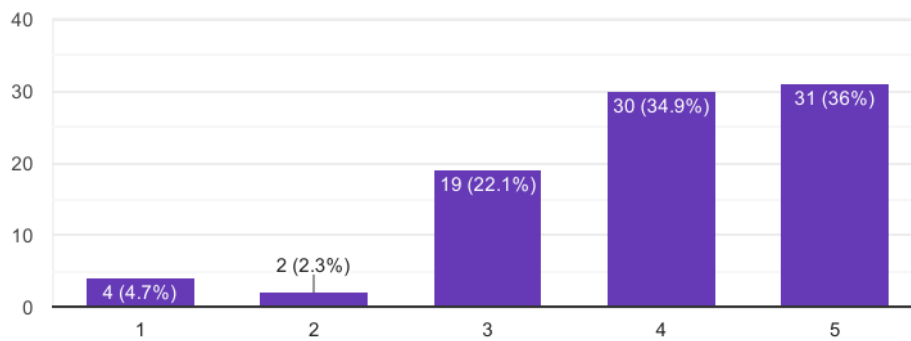


2. How do you rate the quality of teaching in the College?

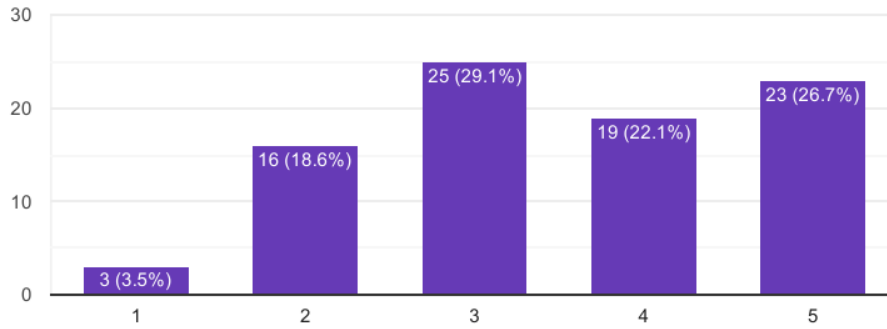


3. What extent do you feel the college effectively integrates **modern learning technology** (e.g., online platforms, digital resources, modern labs) to enhance your child's education

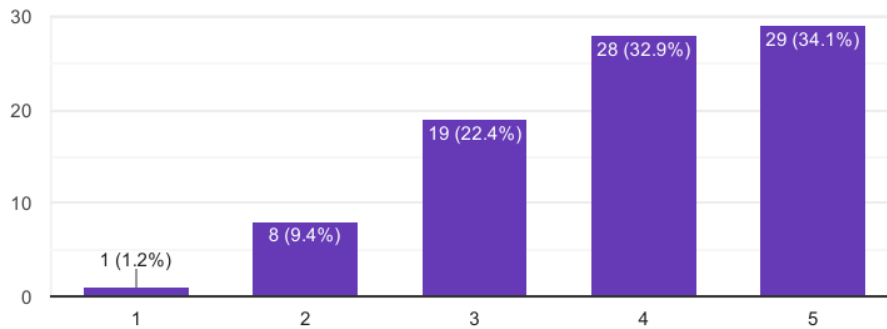


4. How clearly are the grading criteria, evaluation methods (exams, MTT, etc.), and academic progress communicated to your student ?

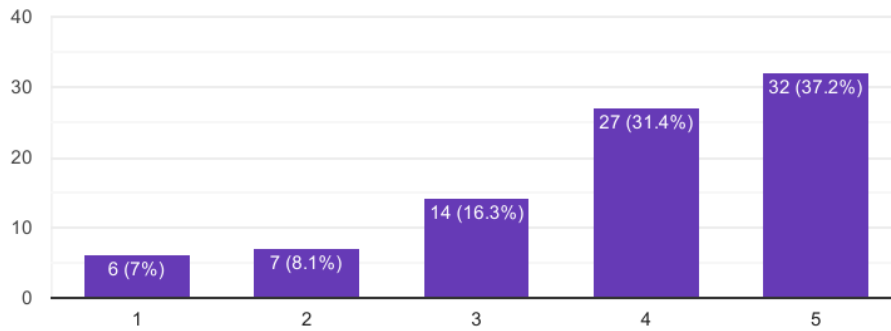

Overall Summary of the survey:

- **Positive:** The majority of parents are satisfied with the **quality of teaching** (70.9% rated 4 or 5) and the **accessibility of faculty and staff** (68.6% rated 4 or 5).
- **Communication:** Over 65% of respondents feel that grading criteria and academic progress are clearly communicated to students.
- **Areas for Growth:** The integration of **modern learning technology** received the lowest high-end ratings, with only 48.8% of parents providing a 4 or 5, and nearly 30% rating it at a neutral 3

ii. Feedback from Alumni

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Govt. College Chamba collected feedback from alumni to assess the effectiveness of academic programs, institutional facilities, and overall student development. The feedback aims to identify strengths, gaps, and areas for improvement to enhance institutional quality. Data collected through structured IQAC Alumni Feedback Form includes both quantitative (ratings) and qualitative (suggestions) responses.

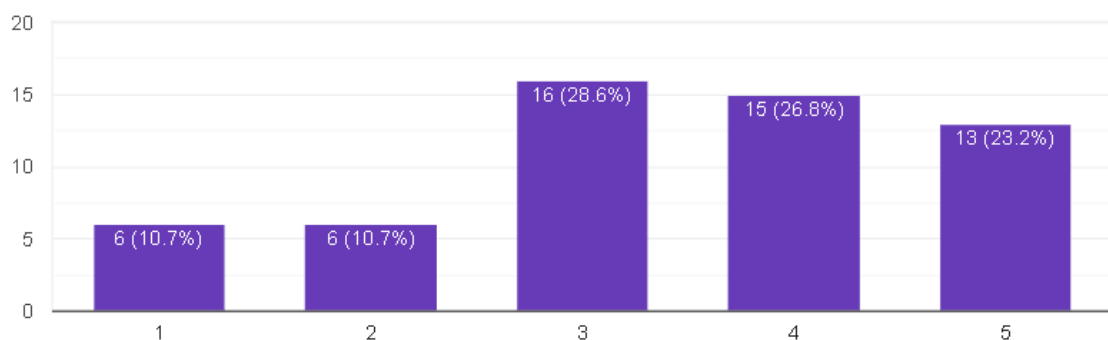

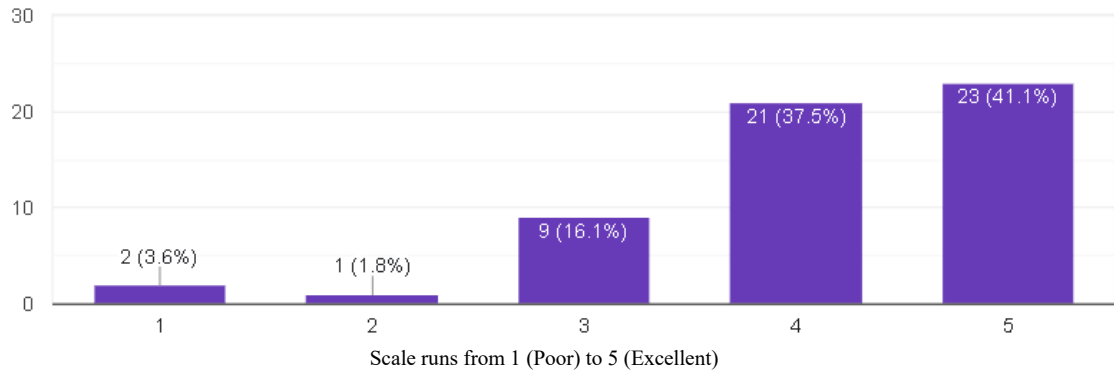

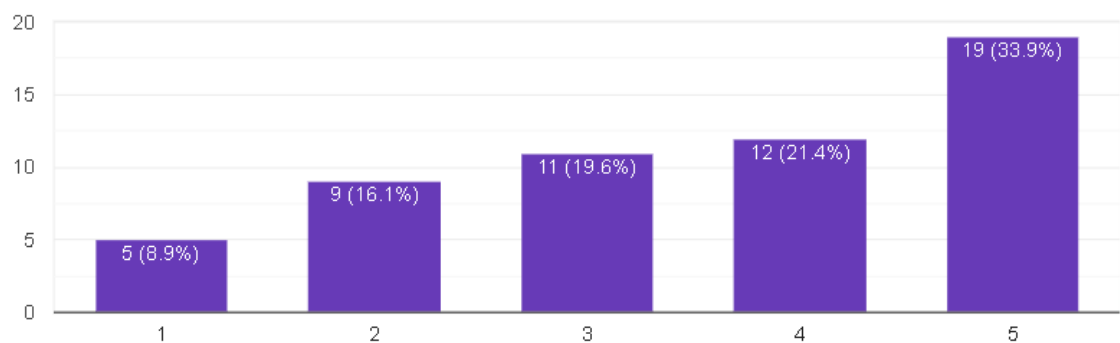

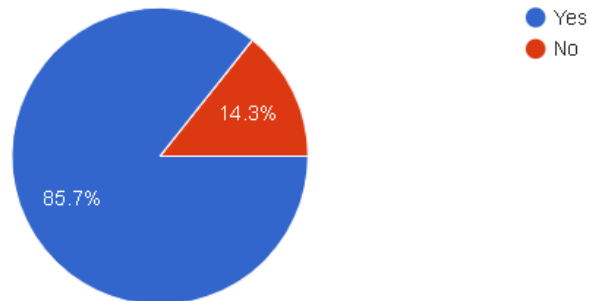

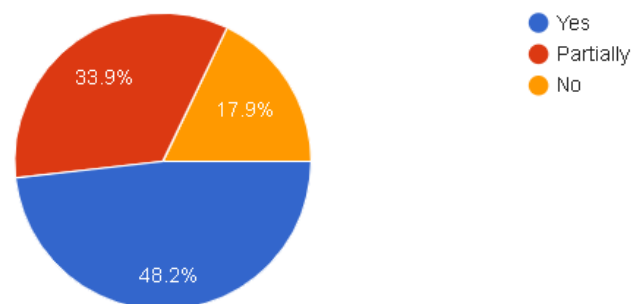

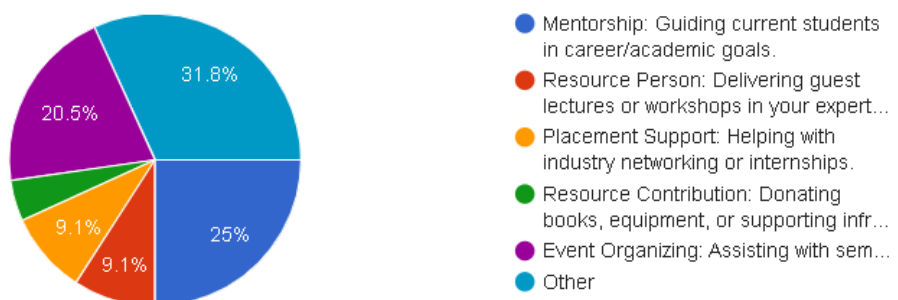

Summary:

The feedback on the teaching-learning process reveals that the majority of alumni rated the quality of teaching and faculty support as good to excellent. This indicates that the institution has maintained a strong academic environment supported by competent and dedicated faculty members. However, when asked about the preparedness for real-world challenges, responses were comparatively mixed. Although the academic foundation is strong, alumni reported a need for greater practical exposure and real-world application of knowledge. There is a noticeable gap in industry-relevant skills such as Artificial Intelligence, coding, cyber security, GIS, entrepreneurship, and advanced laboratory techniques, highlighting the need for integration. With regard to student support services, alumni expressed general satisfaction with the availability of scholarships for meritorious and deserving students. They also acknowledged that the college provides sufficient platforms for extracurricular and non-academic activities, contributing positively to holistic development. However, career counselling and placement assistance emerged as a critical area of concern. A significant proportion of respondents reported inadequate support in this domain, indicating the need for improvement in this domain. Also, infrastructure and basic facilities were identified as areas requiring immediate improvement. Alumni highlighted issues related to sanitation, hostel capacity, internet connectivity, and the need for increasing the number of smart classrooms and digital learning resources. Thus, addressing these concerns is essential for enhancing the overall student experience and supporting academic activities. An encouraging finding of the survey is the willingness of alumni to contribute to the growth and development of the institution. Many respondents expressed interest in participating as mentors, guest lecturers, and resource persons, as well as

supporting placement and networking initiatives. This provides an opportunity to strengthen alumni engagement and build a collaborative academic ecosystem.

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Govt. College Chamba collected feedback from key stakeholders, including parents (86 responses) and alumni (56 responses), to evaluate various aspects of curriculum, teaching-learning processes, student support services, and institutional facilities. The feedback was carefully analyzed, and necessary actions have been initiated to address the concerns and enhance institutional quality.



Classes dated 12/09/2024 के अनुमोदन में शिक्षण राजकीय महाविद्यालय चम्बा में आगामी सत्र 2025 से स्व वित्त पोषित आधारित एम. बी. ए. व एम. सी. ए. की कक्षाएं शुरू करने के दिशानिर्देश प्राप्त हुए हैं। अतः एक कोर्सेस को सुचारु रूप से शुरू करने और कार्यात्मक बनाने हेतु जो भी इस संदर्भ में कार्यवाही उचित है उसका अनुमोदन किया जा सके।

सलाहकार समिति के माननीय सदस्यों द्वारा प्राचार्य महोदय के महाविद्यालय में इन कोर्सेस को शुरू करने के प्रयासों की प्रशंसा करने के उपरान्त सर्वसहमति से निम्नलिखित प्रस्ताव व सुझाव बतारे गए :-

- (1) समिति द्वारा सर्वप्रथम सुझाव दिया गया कि स्व वित्त पोषित आधारित एम. बी. ए. व एम. सी. ए. को सुचारु रूप से कार्यात्मक बनाने हेतु जो भी कोर्सेस के लिए शर्तियातों की नियमितियां की जाएं।

(2) समन्वयक इन कोर्सेस की हिमाचल प्रदेशी विश्वविद्यालय शिमला से सम्बन्धता के सम्बन्ध में आवश्यक औपचारिकता पूर्ण करें। दोनों समन्वयक इन औपचारिकताओं को नए सत्र शुरू होने से पहले पूर्ण कर लें ताकि उक्त कोर्सेस की आगामी कार्यवाही पर कार्य किया जा सके।

(3) इन दोनों कोर्सेस के लिए शुल्क संरचना के सम्पूर्ण विवरण के लिए हि. प्र. विश्वविद्यालय शिमला या अन्य महाविद्यालयों से चर्चा की जाए ताकि शुल्क संरचना का निर्धारण किया जा सके।

(4) मद संख्या 1 के अनुरूप प्राचार्य द्वारा समन्वयक के लिए एम. वी. ए. कोर्स के लिए डा. विजय कुमार सहायक आचार्य वाणिज्य राजकीय महाविद्यालय चम्बा और एम. सी. ए. कोर्स के लिए डा. चमन सिंह सहायक आचार्य राजकीय महाविद्यालय चम्बा के नाम का सुझाव किया गया जिसका समिति के समस्त सदस्यों ने सर्वसम्मति से अनुमोदन किया।

(5) मद संख्या 4 के निर्णय के अनुसार एम. वी. ए. कोर्स के लिए डा. विजय कुमार सहायक आचार्य वाणिज्य राजकीय महाविद्यालय चम्बा और एम. सी. ए. कोर्स के लिए डा. चमन सिंह सहायक आचार्य राजकीय महाविद्यालय चम्बा को प्रस्ताव की दिनांक के प्रभावी होने की तिथि से वहाँ समन्वयक नियुक्त किया जाता है। समिति ने सर्वसम्मति से यहां ये भी निर्णय किया कि दोनों समन्वयकों की नियुक्ति तब तक रहे - पारिजातिक रहेगी जब तक दोनों कोर्सेस के विभागा हेतु अपने-अपने संसाधन न जुटा लें।
