Initially set up in the historic Akhand Chandi Palace, the college presently functions from two campuses - the first campus in the heart of Chamba town and the second campus at Sultanpur. The first campus of the college is situated in historical Chamba town, which is on the right bank of rippling ancient Iravati River (presently Ravi).
